## Part A

The passuk says, "צו את אהרון ואת בניו לאמר" "Command B'nei Aharon and his sons saying". The question is why does the passuk say In the simple pshat, without the word Tzav, Aharon might have thought that the commandment is only telling him and his sons instructions that the avodah is for now. But by the passuk saying, צו את אהרון, according to Rashi, ו"זריזות "for him & his sons to be careful in the mitzvas for now and for the generations to come". How does Rashi learn "זריזות" from the passuk? The answer is, and I think we can all agree with this, that many times, unfortunately, when we are told or asked to do something, especially something when we don't necessarily want to do, we won't see the urgency and so we won't acquiesce very fast to do it. But if we get commanded to do it, well, then naturally we recognize the urgency which inspires us to do what was asked. What is so fundamentally important about being a Zariz? זריזות, a natural offshoot of it, to be commanded, gives the commanded action a sense of importance. It is this very action of making the commanded act important that leaves it with a legacy and tradition to be passed down to future generations.

Another way to convey the importance of our values or actions to future generations is by inspiring them to follow in our way. In Gemara Meseches Tannis א דף' ז אמוד א Rabbi Chanina said: I have learned much from my teachers and even more from my friends, but from my students I have learned more than from all of them. The way I understand this is that learning and teaching can do numerous things, but one of the main outcomes is that we are inspired in this process. Rabbi Channina was saying, "inspire to be inspired." He understood that no one is born inspired, but if we inspire others, we will, in turn, be inspired ourselves. Furthermore, this inspiration will encourage us to continue in our efforts to inspire others, who will then continue the chain of inspiration for future generations. So, what are you waiting for? Go and inspire and make an investment of perpetuity! In this merit may we be zoche to build the final Beis Hamikdash B'korov and If it has already been built may we be zoche to serve in it במהרה בימנו אמן ווא בימור בימו
