Parshas Kedoshim: Human Greatness

The first pasuk in Parshas Kedoshim says, "Kedoshim Te'he'yu... Ki Kadosh Ani..." "You shall be holy... I am holy." The Medrash Rabbah explains that one might have mistakenly thought that a person could attain the same level of holiness as Hashem. The pasuk then teaches us that Hashem's holiness is beyond a person's ability to attain.

This Medrash is difficult to understand. How could a person possibly have thought that a human being could become as holy as Hashem? Hashem is the source of all holiness and spirituality?

Rav Henoch Leibowitz zt'l, explained that the Medrash gives us a glimpse into the true greatness of man. A person is created with a neshama (soul) with the ability to reach such incredible heights of kedusha and perfect himself to the extent that he can be confused with G-d Himself.

We all try to inculcate in ourselves this concept and the words of the Rambam that everyone can become a tzadik like Moshe Rabeinu, and masai yegia masai lemasai avosai as a guiding hashkafa. In fact, Rabeinu Yonah in Sharei Teshuva writes that our first line of defense against our yetzer hara is the knowledge of our incredible self-worth and innate holiness, more than all the mussar and yiras shomayim. May we all be zoche to a clear and deep understanding of our true greatness and merit the coming of Moshiach speedily in our days.
